starts to show a little age on it, one will see cracks in the walls and cracks in the floor; for the house will start to settle in time. It takes work to maintain a home. If one ignores the problems in a home it will fall apart and great will be the ruin of your home.

We spend a lot of time, energy, and money to maintain our homes, and for good reason, because they're expensive. The question is, how much time and energy do we spend on our spiritual home? One may ask, "How does my physical home compare with my spiritual home?" It always goes back to how strong a foundation your home has. If our physical home is built on solid ground it will stand the test of time during the storms of nature. The same is true with our spiritual home. If our spiritual life is not built on a solid foundation it will not stand up against the storms that we encounter in our lives. As Christians, how can our spiritual house develop cracks in the foundation and start to fall apart? A good example is that of a small crack in a wall. Most of us have cracks in the walls in our homes. And we all know that the longer we let that crack stay in the wall, the bigger it will become in due time.

What started out small, turned out to be a big problem. That's the way it is

with our spiritual home. If we let the world draw us away from God it will develop into a small crack. The more we let the world dominate our lives, the crack that started out small between us and God will turn out to be a large gulf. Another way that our spiritual home can develop cracks and fall apart is if we are not studying God's word (the Bible) as we should.

Hosea 4:6 tells us, "My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge."

In our world today, even in this country, there are a lot of false teachers around us. We see them on the TV as so-called preachers who preach part truth and part lies, otherwise known as true lies. These so-called preachers are more into making money off of peoples' emotions than trying to save them. We see mega churches that don't teach the word of God, they use entertainment to bring people to church, and they call this worship. We see movies such as the Da Vinci Code, which is a movie that speaks blasphemy about the life of Jesus. If we, as Christians today, don't study God's word we will fall for anything that sounds good.

2 Timothy 3:1-9

1 But know this, that in the last days perilous times will come: 2 For men will be lovers of themselves, lovers of money, boasters. proud, blasphemers, disobedient to parents, unthankful, unholy, 3 unloving, unforgiving, slanderers, without selfcontrol, brutal, despisers of good, 4 traitors, headstrong, haughty, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God, 5 having a form of godliness but denying its power. And from such people turn away! 6 For of this sort are those who creep into households and make captives of gullible women loaded down with sins, led away by

various lusts, 7 always learning and never able to come to the knowledge of the truth. 8 Now as Jannes and Jambres resisted Moses, so do these also resist the truth: men of corrupt minds, disapproved concerning the faith; 9 but they will progress no further, for their folly will be manifest to all, as theirs also was.

All of us, as Christians, have seen those who had a weak spiritual foundation. When the lure of this world became too great for them they packed their bags and walked away from their first love (Jesus). The end result was that they became part of the world all over again. We have seen how those who were weak responded when hard times came upon them. They blamed God and forsook him. Instead of drawing closer to God, they forsook everything they had gained, they just walked away. The only way that any of us as Christians are going to have a strong foundation, is if we study God's word every day, every hour, and every minute. We need to pray all the time for wisdom, strength, and guidance. Most of all, we need to have a willing heart to follow and love God; and be obedient to God's word and His Son who died for us. You see, neglecting God will weaken our spiritual foundation and the end result will be "great was the fall."
