While we can say that a person is "saved by faith," it is wrong to say that we can be "saved by faith alone." The passages listed clearly show the error of this idea. It does not rob God of His glory to acknowledge that He commands from those whom He will save full obedience to the system of faith contained in the gospel. This is clearly what Scripture teaches and if we are to affirm the truth we can teach nothing less.

Is Salvation By Faith Alone?

Much of the religious world since the days of the Reformation upholds a religious doctrine which claims that salvation is by "faith alone." Is this doctrine what Scripture teaches? If we do word searches for words such as *save*, *saved*, *saves*, and *salvation* we can test this doctrine to see it's soundness.

"SAVE"

“SAVES”

What does the Bible claim “saves” a person? 1.) Baptism through the resurrection of Jesus (1 Peter 3:21).

“SALVATION”

What are some things the Bible says about “Salvation?”

- 1.) There is a “way of salvation” (Acts 16:17).
- 2.) The gospel is “the power of God” to salvation for those who believe (Romans 1:16).
- 3.) Confession is made “unto salvation” (Romans 10:10).
- 4.) Repentance is “to salvation” (2 Corinthians 7:10).
- 5.) One must “work out” their own salvation (Philippians 2:12).
- 6.) Salvation is “through” Jesus (1 Thessalonians 5:9).
- 7.) Salvation is “through sanctification by the Spirit and belief in the truth” (2 Thessalonians 2:13).
- 8.) It is “in Christ Jesus” (2 Timothy 2:10).
- 9.) Wisdom “for salvation” is within the Holy Scriptures (2 Timothy 3:15).
- 10.) Salvation is “to all who obey Him” (Hebrews 5:9).
- 11.) The longsuffering of the Lord leads to salvation (2 Peter 3:15).
- 12.) Salvation will come to those kept by the power of God through faith (1 Peter 1:5).

We see then that the Bible lists several things that are involved in Salvation. Thus it is not correct to claim that salvation is by “faith alone.”

How then are we to understand scriptures such as Ephesians 2:8-9? This passage tells us **“For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of**



yourself; it is the gift of God, not of works lest anyone should boast” (NKJV).

The means which God has offered mankind unto salvation is something for which man can take no credit at all! Since only Jesus' blood can cover man's sins there is nothing that we can do to merit our own forgiveness. Yet God
