And this is the victory that has overcome the world—OUR FAITH" (1 John 5:4-5 emphasis mine).

Faith is the Victory

erhaps one of the most powerful and effective weapons in the history of war, has been the employment of psychological tactics, or "psychological warfare". It is defined as "the use of propaganda, threats, or other psychological techniques to mislead, intimidate, demoralize, or otherwise influence the thinking or behavior of an opponent" (Dictionary.com). Recently, in the news and other media, we've no doubt heard about the morale of troops in the field and the corresponding predictions as to how their mental state will affect their fighting ability. As soldiers for Christ, we face the same struggle, for our Enemy uses those tactics against us. We are always exposed to stories in the media about murderers, rapists, and other vile people who are at large or, even worse, never brought to justice. Still more, we are faced with other evils: hate groups masquerading as po-

litical organizations with an agenda to legalize gay marriage, abortion, and marijuana etc. to the overall detriment of society. As we see these kinds of groups making progress toward their goals, it can be easy for us to feel overwhelmed and underestimate the influence we may have on the local populace. Let us turn to Scripture, now, and notice



the comforting words God has given us concerning this matter.

First, we must understand that the immorality we see in the world is to be expected and, furthermore, we should not be surprised at the progressive nature we see in the corruption of society's values. The Spirit inspired Paul to write, "...evil men and imposters will proceed from BAD TO WORSE, deceiving and being deceived" and again we should "avoid empty and worldly chatter, for it will lead to further ungodliness, and their talk will spread like gangrene" (2 Tim. 3:13; 2:16-17 NASB emphasis mine). Notice that Paul says "their talk will spread like gangrene"; do you suppose "their talk" would include the ungodly agenda that is preached in favor of legalizing many sins? Despite the prominence of wayward thinking and teaching in the world, we cannot allow ourselves to become demoralized and discouraged, or lose our desire to speak the truth of God. Jesus Himself testified that we would have trouble so long as we remained in this world, but in the same breath He tells us to "take heart" for He has "overcome the world" (John16:33).

As God's people and soldiers in His army, we share in His conquest—His "overcoming the world". Consider what Paul said to the church at Rome,

"...we overwhelmingly conquer through Him who loved us"; but this leads us to ask, "How are we conquerors when evil still prevails in the world?" Let us consider several passages beginning with the book of Hebrews: "Inasmuch then as the children have partaken of flesh and blood. He Himself likewise shared in the same, that through death He might DE-STROY HIM who had the power of death, that is, THE DEVIL, and release those who through fear of death were all their lifetime subject to bondage" (Heb. 2:14-15 emphasis mine). Christ has destroyed the power of the devil, so that we may no longer fear death. Paul knew that Christ had fulfilled Isaiah's prophecy and says, "'Death is swallowed up in VICTO-RY. O Death, where is your victory? O Death, where is your sting?'The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law; but thanks be to God, who GIVES US VIC-TORY through our Lord Jesus Christ" (1 Cor. 15:54-57; cf. Is. 25:8 emphasis mine). Brethren, we have nothing to fear, not even death itself! Paul asks, "If God be for us, who can be against us?" (Rom. 8:31), and then assures us that there is absolutely nothing that can separate us from the love of Christ (cf. Rom. 8:38-39). The only thing that can separate us

from Christ is ourselves, and the sin we commit, but we are promised that "if we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness" (1 John 1:9). Brethren let us make every effort to abide in His Word so that we may stand in His grace for "there is now no condemnation for **THOSE IN Christ Jesus**" (Rom. 8:1; cf. John 15:10; Col.1:22-23 emphasis mine). We can be confident, brethren, that *His* victory *is our* victory, and nothing can take that from us, neither death, nor the devil himself.

Finally, we can take comfort in knowing that all the evil in the world
